



Niagara Region High School Students to Receive Lifesaving AED Training Program, High Schools to Receive AEDs

5,700 students will be trained annually to use Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)

ST. CATHARINES, ONTARIO- - The Advanced Coronary Treatment (ACT) Foundation is thrilled to announce that as a result of a unique new partnership between ACT, the Government of Ontario, FirstOntario Credit Union, and Heart Niagara Inc., more than 5,700 Niagara Region high school students in 30 schools will be trained each year on the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). This lifesaving training will help expand students' capacity to respond to cardiac emergencies beyond their CPR training.

An AED is an easy-to-use device that can tell when a heart stops beating effectively and deliver an electric shock to help restart the heart. Funding will provide an AED for 23 Niagara high schools, adding to the schools in the region which already have an AED. Funding will also provide AED training units and mannequins for student training. This generous donation will ensure every high school in both the District School Board of Niagara and the Niagara Catholic District School Board has the lifesaving unit on site, as well as the knowledge and training to use it in emergencies that might involve teachers, students, or citizens attending adult education or community events.

FirstOntario Credit Union is providing the funds to establish the ACT High School AED Program in Niagara Region schools. The program will be an enhancement to the already established region-wide Grade 9 CPR training program, run by ACT partner Heart Niagara Inc. Also contributing is the Government of Ontario, which in 2008, invested \$1.4 million as seed funding to help the ACT Foundation expand the AED training program to all Ontario high schools. ACT's four core partners, AstraZeneca, Bristol-Myers Squibb Canada, Pfizer Canada and sanofi-aventis, provide sustaining funding for the ACT Foundation, and are committed to ACT's efforts to establish the program in the Niagara Region and across Canada.

"I am pleased our government has partnered with the ACT Foundation to deliver lifesaving AED training and AED units to high schools across Niagara," said St. Catharines MPP, Jim Bradley. "Having these devices located in our high schools is both a valuable learning opportunity for our youth and will benefit the overall health and safety of our community."

"This is an excellent program that gives our youth the skills to save lives at home and in our communities," said Niagara Falls MPP, Kim Craitor. "I am amazed that through this program, each year more than 5,700 students in the Niagara Region will be empowered to save lives."

Research shows that citizen CPR, combined with the use of an AED, can considerably improve survival rates if applied in the first few minutes of a cardiac arrest.

"FirstOntario Credit Union is committed to helping our communities prosper," says FirstOntario Credit Union President and CEO Kelly McGiffin. "This AED enhancement program is a valuable initiative and one we are very proud to support in the Niagara Region. The AED equipment and training program is an important aspect in the safety and protection of the whole community. "It is an unfortunate reality that cardiac arrest can strike people of all ages and fitness levels, often with little warning. This training will help ensure that our students have the confidence, ability and resources to act during an emergency. "Niagara Catholic has a commitment to student and staff health and safety with trained emergency response teams at all Board sites. Through the support of Heart Niagara, students and staff in our Niagara Catholic elementary and secondary schools are trained in emergency first aid to respond quickly in a medical emergency," said Niagara Catholic Director of Education, John Crocco. "Automated defibrillators provide essential medical technology in an emergency. We are grateful to our partners for providing Niagara Catholic with a defibrillator in each of our Catholic secondary schools and the training to educate our students in such a practical, essential, life-saving skill."

"Training young people in CPR and AED gives them the tools to help others in overcoming sudden cardiac arrest in our schools and in the our community," said Dr. Doug Munkley, Medical Director Community Public Access Defibrillation, Heart Niagara Inc. "It also gives them a greater awareness of the impact of heart disease and helps to strengthen the message about making healthy heart lifestyle choices."
